

TEXAS COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY (TCEQ) UPDATE JUNE 30, 2011, SETPMTIC MEETING

On June 8, 2011, the commissioners approved proposal of the following projects.

- Houston-Galveston-Brazoria Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) Analysis Update State Implementation Plan (SIP) Revision (Project No. 2010-028-SIP-NR). The proposed HGB RACT analysis update SIP revision focuses specifically on the seven Control Techniques Guidelines (CTG) documents issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency from 2006 through 2008 that have not been addressed in the HGB attainment demonstration SIP revision adopted March 10, 2010, and incorporates concurrently proposed CTG-related rulemaking. The proposed rulemaking would implement RACT for flexible package printing; industrial cleaning solvents; large appliance coatings; metal furniture coatings; paper, film, and foil coatings; miscellaneous industrial adhesives; and miscellaneous metal and plastic parts coatings in the HGB area. - 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 115 Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) RACT Rule Revisions (Rule Project No. 2010-016-115-EN). This is the rule revision resulting from the above RACT analysis of the seven CTGs. Contact: Francis Dowiak, (512) 239-3931, Francis.Dowiak@tceq.texas.gov.
- 30 TAC Chapter 115 VOC Storage Rule Revision (Rule Project No. 2010-025-115-EN). This rule revision applies to storage vessels in the DFW nonattainment area. Contact Dr. Bob Gifford, (512) 239-3149, Bob.Gifford@tceq.texas.gov

New legislation regarding the Texas Emissions Reduction Plan (TERP) Program

- Senate Bill 527 - eliminated the New Technology Research and Development Program and provided for use of TERP funds for an Air Monitoring Program in North Texas
- House Bill 3399 changed some of the criteria for the existing grant programs
- Senate Bill 20 and SB 385 (same provisions, but numbered differently) established several new grant programs: Alternative Fueling Facilities Program; Texas Natural Gas Vehicle Grant Program; and Clean Transportation Triangle grant program for natural gas fueling stations
